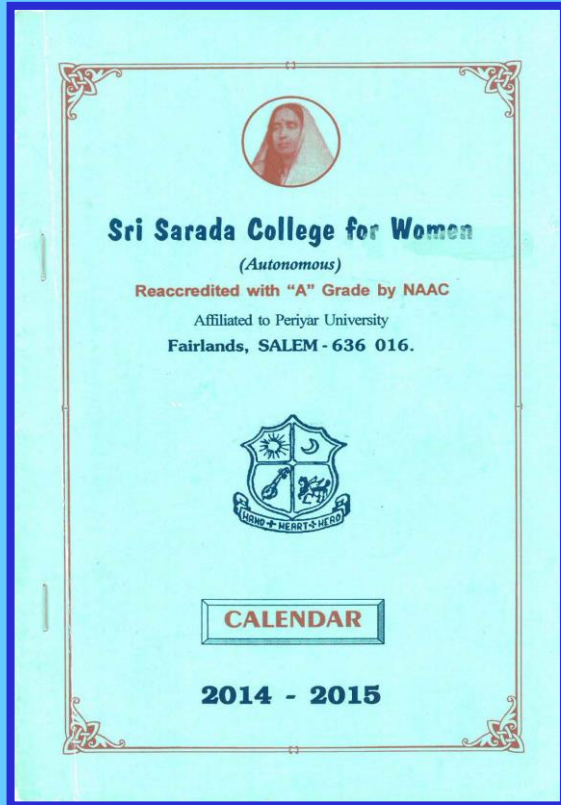

ABOUT OURSELVES

Sri Sarada College was started in the year 1961 by Mrs. Seethalakshmi Ramaswamy under the benign grace and Presidentship of Srimath Swami Chidbhananda of Sri Ramakrishna Tapovanam, Tirupparaithurai. The College is managed by Sri Sarada College Educational Trust run by Yatiswaris of Sri Sarada Samiti, Salem. The Institution was elevated to the first grade level in 1962. Autonomous status was conferred in the year 1988-89 under the able guidance of Yatiswari Saradapriya. The College which had been affiliated to the University of Madras since its inception is now affiliated to Periyar University from 1-1-1998. The College has its own autonomous structure in its curriculum and extra curricular activities. The College was accredited with Four Stars in 2002, re-accredited with B Grade (2.94 on a 4 point scale) in 2008 and re-accredited with A Grade in 2014 by NAAC. Much emphasis is given for discipline, national culture and physical culture. Under the autonomous system, students enjoy the benefit of Continuous Assessment (CA), to be added to the Semester Examination marks to enable them to perform better. Skill based subjects of interdisciplinary nature are offered. Several certificate courses are also offered.

The aim of the College is to offer modern and career oriented education in the background of our ancient culture and tradition, based on the ideals of Bhagavan Sri Ramakrishna Paramahansa, Holy Mother Sri Sarada Devi and Swami Vivekananda.

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COLLEGE RULES AND GENERAL DISCIPLINE

- The college will function from 9.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. and from 2.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. with lunch interval between 1.00 p.m. to 2.00 p.m. Any absence from class during working hours, without the prior permission of the parents and the Principal, will be strictly dealt with and serious action will be taken. The college will have coaching classes from 4.00 p.m. to 5.00 p.m.
- Only lunch card-holders will be permitted to go home for lunch.
- The first bell for the morning session will be rung at 9.15 a.m. when all students must assemble for prayer. Attendance at morning assembly is compulsory for all students and staff and they must make it a point to be punctual.
- Saturdays and Sundays will be weekly holidays.
- College students are permitted to wear either half saree or saree and no other types of dresses will be permitted, while they enter the college premises.
- Students are expected to come in the college uniform on the first Monday of each month and on special occasions which will be announced as and when they arise. They are requested not to wear the uniform saree on other days. They should wear the college badge everyday for identification.
- While attending a class, a meeting in the College or other gatherings, students are expected to be attentive, silent and maintain decorum.
- The cleanliness of the college building and surroundings should be the responsibility of every student. Every student should help to keep the class room and the college premises neat and clean.
- The arrangement of the furniture in the class room should not be disturbed by the students on any account.
- Students are expected to read notices put up on the college notice board carefully every day in the morning as soon as they arrive and in the evening before they leave. Ignorance of any notice, thus put up, will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with it.

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- No private meeting or party of any kind shall be held in the college without the prior permission of the Principal.
- No notice of any kind be circulated among students or put up on the notice board without the prior permission of the Principal.
- Private collection of funds must not be made without the prior approval of the Principal.
- The students who indulge in any undesirable activities against the interest and discipline of the college will be dealt with seriously.
- All students shall take periodical tests / assignments and examinations sincerely and to the best of their ability. They should not possess any manuscript inside the examination hall, nor should they communicate with persons inside and outside the hall. If they violate this rule, they will be treated as guilty of malpractice and be severely punished.

AUTONOMOUS STATUS :

The college follows semester pattern. Being an autonomous College the students are evaluated by periodical tests, assignments and mid semester examinations in internal assessment for 25 marks and by external public examination for 75 marks under CBCS. (30 : 70 for students admitted from 2013 - 2014 onwards)

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- Attendance will be taken every hour in the respective class rooms.
- A student who is not in the class when attendance is taken shall be marked absent. However, a student who comes late may be marked present by the Lecturer if a proper explanation is provided.
- No student will be allowed to absent herself from the college without leave letter for which she must apply in advance stating explicit reasons for her absence, counter signed by the parent / guardian / hostel superintendent & H.O.D.

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- In cases where absence is due to unforeseen causes an application for leave should be submitted as soon as possible and in no case later than the first day of her return to the college.
- 75% attendance is compulsory for every student to appear for the semester exams. Students with attendance 62.5% to 75% can appear for exams by paying a condonation fee Rs. 500/-. Students with 50% to 62.5% attendance can appear for the papers as arrears in the next semester by paying the condonation amount of Rs. 500/- in the immediate next semester following the semester in which there was lack of 75% attendance. If a student has less than 50% attendance she has to redo the semester. There is no maternity leave concession. Even if a candidate has sufficient attendance, if she obtains TC before the commencement of the semester examinations, she is not eligible to attend the semester examinations.

NCC / N:S / SOCIAL SERVICE LEAGUE :

The candidates will be enrolled as cadets / volunteers according to their applications to the college during admission.

LIBRARY

- The library is under the direct control of Principal and the Librarian.
- All students of the college, teachers, clerical staff and other officials of the college are entitled to use the library.
- The Library shall be open on all working days from 6.30 a.m. to 8.00 p.m.
- SILENCE shall be strictly observed in the Library.
- Each student shall borrow not more than one book at a time once a week.
 - They shall be responsible for all books borrowed by them on borrower's tickets.
 - A student who has lost a book shall make a written report of the same to the Librarian.
 - Students and staff should not carry any book or any printed matter into the Library and they shall leave their own books in the room provided for that purpose near the library.

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5. Students shall not write upon, damage or make any mark upon any book, periodicals, manuscript or map belonging to the library. If a book is damaged, or lost, the person shall be held responsible to replace it by a new copy.
 6. No tracing or mechanical reproduction shall be made without permission from the librarian.
 7. Students are not allowed to sub-lend the books of the library to any person in any circumstance.
- VI
1. Students will be entitled to keep a book for seven days from the date of issue. At the end of the period the book shall be returned to the library.
 2. A student failing to return the book after 7 days from the date of issue will be fined Re. 1/- for each day of delay for every book.
 3. Books falling due on holidays may be returned on the next working day.
 4. A student may get the same book renewed for a period of another 7 days provided it has not in the meantime been applied for by another student.
 5. Any book may be recalled by the Librarian at any time at her discretion.
- VII
1. All the members of the staff and students have open access to the shelves.
 2. The total number of books on loan with the members of the staff at any time shall not exceed generally ten volumes.
 3. Encyclopaedias, dictionaries and books which might be difficult to replace and be considered necessary for reference shall not be lent out.
 4. Periodicals are issued on loan only to members of the staff. Current periodicals may be taken out of the Library only during such hours as the Library is closed.
 5. A Department Library for Post-Graduate students is maintained.

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6. There is a text book library to lend text books to the need and deserving students.
7. All books should be returned to the library by staff members & students at the end of the year.

The Articulation and Idea Fixation classes (A.I.F.) are conducted between 2-00 p.m and 2-30 p.m on every IV day order.

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VALUE EDUCATION

Discourses in Ramayana and Mahabharatha, the two National Epics are conducted in alternate years.

COUNSELLING CLASS

Counselling is done along with moral instruction on the first Monday of every month.

PERSONALITY ASSESSMENT

Regular assessment will be made of a student's academic, co-curricular and extra curricular activities along with other special attainments, character and conduct during the course of her study. A cumulative record of this Personality Assessment will be presented to the students at the end of the Under Graduate and Post Graduate course of study.

CERTIFICATES : APPLICATION FOR THE ISSUE OF TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

Transfer Certificate must be applied for in the prescribed form which is available in the office. Ordinarily notice of 48 hours is necessary for the issue of a certificate.

CERTIFICATE FEES :

The Certificates are issued at the following fees if the students ask for them a year after they leave the college.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are awarded every year under various schemes to the poor and deserving students of B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., M.A., and M.Sc., M.Phil., Ph.D., classes. The students can avail themselves of the scholarships every year.

The award of scholarships is decided on the basis of performance of candidates at the Public and University Examinations and on communal basis. Candidates must secure 75% attendance during the year of study.

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Scholarships once awarded, normally continue for the full course. However, they will be cancelled at any time, if the character or conduct or progress of the student is not satisfactory.

NATURE OF SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE AS PER THE PRESCRIBED RULES AND CONDITIONS

FEE CONCESSION

1. FEE CONCESSION SC/ST, Converted Christian from SC need not pay tuition fees. Candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), converted christian from SC, Most Backward Communities (MBC) and Denotified Communities (DNC) are eligible for free education. They have to produce the copy of community certificate from the Tahsildar.
2. Under E. V. R. Nagammai Free Education Scheme for Degree Courses, students of Backward Communities (BC) and other Communities (OC) are eligible for Tuition Fee concession, where the Parent's / Guardian's annual income is below Rs. 24,000/- and income certificate in Form 92 MER should be submitted along with the application form.
3. SC / ST / MBC / DNC / SC converts are eligible for scholarships irrespective of their parent's annual income. Hence they must submit a copy of the plus two mark statement, community certificate and T.C. before 31.8.2013. If they fail to submit the above copies on or before 31.8.2013 scholarship will not be sanctioned. For renewal of scholarship by II and III UG Students and II PG Students they have to submit a copy of Community certificate and Mark Statements before 31-7-2013.
