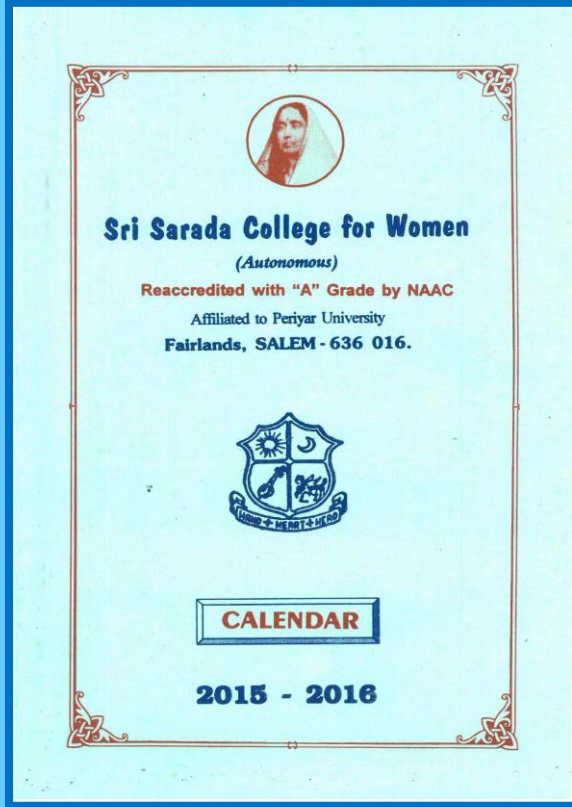

### COLLEGE RULES AND GENERAL DISCIPLINE

- The college will function from 9.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. and from 2.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. with lunch interval between 1.00 p.m. to 2.00 p.m. Any absence from class during working hours, without the prior permission of the parents and the Principal, will be strictly dealt with and serious action will be taken. The college will have coaching classes from 4.00 p.m. to 5.00 p.m.
- Only lunch card-holders will be permitted to go home for lunch.
- The first bell for the morning session will be rung at 9.15 a.m. when all students must assemble for prayer. Attendance at morning assembly is compulsory for all students and staff and they must make it a point to be punctual.
- Saturdays and Sundays will be weekly holidays.
- College students are permitted to wear either half saree or saree and no other types of dresses will be permitted, while they enter the college premises.
- Students are expected to come in the college uniform on the first Monday of each month and on special occasions which will be announced as and when they arise. They are requested not to wear the uniform saree on other days. They should wear the college badge everyday for identification.
- While attending a class, a meeting in the College or other gatherings, students are expected to be attentive, silent and maintain decorum.

Students with 50% to 62.5% attendance can appear for the papers as arrears in the next semester by paying the condonation amount of Rs. 500/- in the immediate next semester following the semester in which there was lack of 75% attendance. If a student has less than 50% attendance she has to redo the semester. There is no maternity leave concession. Even if a candidate has sufficient attendance, if she obtains TC before the commencement of the semester examinations, she is not eligible to attend the semester examinations.

#### NCC / NSS / SOCIAL SERVICE LEAGUE :

The candidates will be enrolled as cadets / volunteers according to their applications to the college during admission.

#### LIBRARY

- I. The library is under the direct control of Principal and the Librarian.
- II. All students of the college, teachers, clerical staff and other officials of the college are entitled to use the library.
- III. The Library shall be open on all working days from 6.30 a.m. to 8.00 p.m.
- IV. SILENCE shall be strictly observed in the Library.
- V.
  1. Each student shall borrow not more than one book at a time once a week.
  2. They shall be responsible for all books borrowed by them or borrower's tickets.
  3. A student who has lost a book shall make a written report of the same to the Librarian.
  4. Students and staff should not carry any book or any printed matter into the Library and they shall leave their own book in the room provided for that purpose near the library.

5. Students shall not write upon, damage or make any mark upon any book, periodicals, manuscript or map belonging to the library. If a book is damaged, or lost, the person shall be held responsible to replace it by a new copy.
  6. No tracing or mechanical reproduction shall be made without permission from the librarian.
  7. Students are not allowed to sub-lend the books of the library to any person in any circumstance.
- VI
1. Students will be entitled to keep a book for seven days from the date of issue. At the end of the period the book shall be returned to the library.
  2. A student failing to return the book after 7 days from the date of issue will be fined Re. 1/- for each day of delay for every book.
  3. Books falling due on holidays may be returned on the next working day.
  4. A student may get the same book renewed for a period of another 7 days provided it has not in the meantime been applied for by another student.
  5. Any book may be recalled by the Librarian at any time at her discretion.
- VII
1. All the members of the staff and students have open access to the shelves.
  2. The total number of books on loan with the members of the staff at any time shall not exceed generally ten volumes.
  3. Encyclopaedias, dictionaries and books which might be difficult to replace and be considered necessary for reference shall not be lent out.
  4. Periodicals are issued on loan only to members of the staff. Current periodicals may be taken out of the Library only during such hours as the Library is closed.
  5. A Department Library for Post-Graduate students is maintained.

#### SCHOLARSHIPS

1. FEE CONCESSION SC/ST, Converted Christian from SC need not pay tuition fees. They have to produce the copy of community certificate from the Tahsildar.
