1.4.2 - How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

#### Feedback Obtained

The feedback mechanism of the institution is focused to either affirm or alter the course of action in the current academic year. Programme wise and faculty wise feedback of the students for the academic year are collected and analyzed every year. While appraising the curriculum the following parameters namely, depth of

the course, its applicability to real life, extent of employability, understandability was taken into consideration by the students. On the other hand, feedback of teachers was obtained on the indices namely, knowledge, teaching methodology, communication skill, commitment, motivation and accessibility. After collecting the filled in feedback forms, the data were analyzed with the help of statistical tools. As the alumni is found to be the ambassadors of our institution, the feedback of the alumni and the students are given equal and due consideration. Early opening of the library in the morning and extension of library hours in the evenings and during study holidays were demanded and immediately implemented. More number of skill based subjects, subjects with employability skills, variety of certificate courses were the prominent requests of the alumni and students of 2017 - 2018 and accordingly it was focused while restructuring the syllabus during the academic year in the Board of studies meeting. The students requested the remedial coaching classes to continue for the slow learners in UG courses and the staff members also agreed the same. The mentor mentee system was appreciated. The students have suggested to have more number of placement training activities to get placements. It was taken care of by the placement officers of the college. Some parents demanded ICT enabled teaching for their wards. As a follow up measure, ICT enabled class rooms were facilitated and the demand for virtual labs is going to be addressed soon. The prayer, physical exercises and teaching of value education were very much acknowledged and appreciated by the parents. The faculty members are cognizant of the employer's feedback too. The feedback mechanism serves as a catalyst to foster the development of the institution.

Classrooms, Departments, Seminar Halls, Auditorium are regularly cleaned by support staff appointed by the management. There is an association named "Spic and Span" which ensures the maintenance of the cleanliness in the campus. Regular checking of classrooms is supervised by the members of this association. The Campus maintenance is monitored through surveillance cameras. The infrastructure maintenance which includes civil, plumbing, electrical, furniture repair and other is also regularly done and checked. The Library holdings consist of books and journals which are available for the students. The stock is regularly checked and improved according to the need of the hour. The Egate register is installed in the library and the visitors - both the staff and students are required to enter their Bar coded ID number during their entry and exit. The software libsinet is installed for the effective issue of books to the students and the staff members. The library has twenty computers which are mainly used for Research. PhD and MPhil students find it useful by accessing INFLIBNET and various resources such journals and magazines. The Computer Labs are efficient and the systems are monitored regularly. Any glitches are solved immediately with the help of technical assistants.

The Physical Education department is facilitated by the Physical Directress to educate the students. The Sports ground is well maintained and all the kits required for the players are provided in proper condition. Parking facility is well organized for both the faculty members and the students separately. Every department maintains separate record for the stock management and equipments and they are regularly inspected and verified at the end of every year. Lab assistants are employed to take care of the lab equipments and accessories. There is adequate potable water for drinking and the water taps are available in the campus at various parts. The washrooms are regularly cleaned for the usage of the students. There is a systematic disposal of wastes in the campus.

#### 7.2 - Best Practices

The daily prayer has motivated our students and faculty members to learn the greatest virtues like punctuality, accountability and spirituality. All the students and faculty members assemble in the college auditorium and attend the daily prayer. Students are trained to sing devotional songs and to chant mantras. This prayer was initiated by our founders in the year 1961 and we still follow it with more hope and pride. All are trained to follow the order of prayer irrespective of caste and creed. The prayer is followed by the general knowledge session. After the prayer, they move to the ground for physical exercise in order to maintain their physical fitness. Exercise is a great way to increase the confidence level and attitude of our students. Best Practice 2. Transparency in academic functions: Students enrolment is on merit basis and the reservation and relaxation of eligibility are as per the government norms. Admission committee ensures transparency in the Students admission process. Standard procedure of teaching evaluation of students is done step wise through preparation of time tables, teaching material, power point presentation, internal assessment, classroom and lab conduction, midterm and end semester examination. The grievances regarding valuation are redressed by giving a chance to apply for re

totalling and revaluation. The institution collects minimum fee prescribed by the university in order to facilitate Economically backward students. The academic calendar is provided to the students which are strictly followed to ensure academic gain. Six days a week schedule is followed in order to develop the culture of hard work. The semester results are declared within 2 days after the semester examinations. The campus had no unrest since its inception and furthers a peaceful life. The institution has highly qualified and dedicated faculty members. Language lab enhances the communication skills of students, helping them to equip for the job market. Regular inputs are taken from the faculty for continuous improvement in the system and innovative ideas regarding admission, examination and maintenance. Frequent monthly meetings of HODs, faculty, IQAC members are conducted to ensure transparency and take continuous corrective steps. Auxiliary services of the placement cell, entrepreneurial development cell, hostel, bakery, canteen, photocopier facility, printing press, health centres ensure quality with the collaborative efforts of administrable academic staff and students.

During Annual day celebrations, the histrionic talents of the students are displayed through dramas and the depiction of the famous characters are observed and appreciated by all the stakeholders. The teaching of the epics such as righteousness, love, compassion, and other virtues, importance of family and sacredness of the society are reiterated through these cultural events. Besides Ramayana and Mahabharata, the spiritual values of Sri Ramakrishna, Sri Sarada Devi and Swamy Vivekananda, based on the intrinsic purity exhibited by one's code of conduct is portrayed to the students through drama, daily thoughts for the day in the morning assembly, display boards carrying quotes of the trinities in various places of the campus, etc. Life history of Sri Sarada Devi, who is reverentially addressed as Holy Mother, is depicted and displayed through models on Sri Sarada Jayanthi function celebrated every year by this holy institution. This ritual is celebrated as the sign of reverence and honour as a role model of sacred woman in the society.
