NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

National Service Scheme (NSS) is a Central Sector Scheme of the Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports developed with the primary aim of developing student's personality through community service. NSS was launched on 24th September 1969, the birth Centenary year of Father of Nation by the then Union Education Minister Dr. V.K.R.V. Rao. NSS volunteers work on various social issues, fostering a sense of civic responsibility and national integration. NSS are voluntary organizations that recruit students from high schools, colleges, and universities across India. It highlights social consciousness, community engagement, instill a spirit of selfless service and contribute significantly to character building. National Service Scheme (NSS) was introduced in 1969 with the primary objective of developing the personality and character of the student youth through voluntary community service. 'Education through Service' is the purpose of the NSS. The ideological orientation of the NSS is inspired by the ideals of Mahatma Gandhi. An NSS volunteer places the 'community' before 'self'.

NSS BADGE

The NSS Symbol is embossed on the badge based on the "Rath" wheel of the Konark Sun Temple situated in Odisha. The eight bars in the wheel represent the 24 hours of a day. The red color indicates that the volunteer is full of young blood that is lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit. The navy blue color indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of the mankind. The giant wheels of the Sun Temple portray the cycle of creation, preservation and release, and signify the movement in life across time and space.


RALLY ON INTERANATIONAL YOGA DAY


THIRD SESSION (2.00 P.M) SPECIAL LECTURE ON LIFE SAVING SKILLS


CYCLE RALLY ON DRUG AWARENESS
